APPEAL OF SEPA REVIEW OF A RURAL INDUSTRIAL LAND BANK DESIGNATION

The Board will consider an appeal on the addendum to the 2007 Comprehensive Plan EIS adopted as part of the SEPA review process The Board will not take public testimony in hearing this appeal

DESIGNATION OF A RURAL INDUSTRIAL LAND BANK

Clark County received an application for a rural industrial land bank pursuant to Growth Management Act, RCW 36 70A 367, in February of 2014 The proposed location is 600 acres of land on both sides of SR-503 north of NE 119th Street and south of Brush Prairie Since that time the county has been working Brush Prairie Since that time the county has been working with a consultant to meet the statutory requirements for establishing the land bank The requirements include an inventory of possible industrial sites, consultation with affected cities, development of a master plan concept, development of plan concept, development of regulations that will be applied regulations that will be applied to all land bank uses, and an environmental review at the programmatic level To establish the land bank, the Board would be adopting a change in the comprehensive plan designation and zoning for the parcels included, adding new plan policies on the land bank, adopting a set of regulations for land bank developments, and amending the county's and amending the county's Artenal Atlas
